The following competitions (Men and Women) were not concluded due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions:

- Premier League 2019/20
- League One 2019/20
- Scottish Cup 2019/20
- Scottish Plate 2019/20

SCOTTISH CUP/ PLATE (Men and Women)

Due to the impracticality of concluding both the Scottish Cup and Plate 2019/20 at a later stage, these two competitions have been declared **null and void.**

PREMIER LEAGUE (Men and Women)

Principles:

- Winners are awarded in both genders based on:
 - Standing points
 - o Significant margin between the top team and the runner up.
- No relegation

WOMEN'S PREMIER LEAGUE WINNERS: Su Ragazzi with 33 points and 0 losses.

MEN'S PREMIER LEAGUE WINNERS: City of Edinburgh with 32 points and 0 losses.

LEAGUE ONE (Men and Women)

Principles:

Winners are awarded only in Women's League One based on


- Standing points
 - o Significant margin between the top team and the runner up.
- No winners awarded in Men's League One:
 - There is no significant standing points margin amongst the top 3 teams
- Promotion of the top two teams

WOMEN'S LEAGUE ONE

WOMEN'S LEAGUE WINNERS: Edinburgh Jets with 35 point and 0 losses.

- The following teams will duly be promoted to Premier League
 - Edinburgh Jets
 - o Glasgow International

MEN'S LEAGUE ONE



Given the <u>current standings</u>, it is not possible to declare a champion because the margin is not clear enough and because the teams have not played the same amount of games.

The following teams will be duly promoted to Premier League

- o Dundee
- University of Edinburgh

Forza Ragazzi is, as per standing points, ranked first; however, University of Edinburgh and Dundee have only played respectively only 12 and 11 matches and not 13. University of Edinburgh and Dundee are being promoted to the Premier League based on their higher winning ratio:

Dundee

- 12 matches, 10 wins and 2 losses
- Winning ratio 83%

University of Edinburgh

- 11 matches, 9 wins, 2 losses
- Winning ratio 82%

Forza Ragazzi:

- 13 matches, 10 wins and 3 losses
- Winning ratio 77%

If we were to declare the end of the season to when the top 3 teams of the league had played 11 matches each, the ranking would be:

- Dundee with 29 points
- University of Edinburgh with 28 points
- Forza Ragazzi with 25 points

Therefore, University of Edinburgh, by being in second position in the league, would still be promoted together with Dundee.
